“Pro bono legal service to the poor need not be provided only through legal services to individuals; it can also be provided through legal services to charitable, religious, or educational organizations whose overall mission and activities are designed predominately to address the needs of the poor. For example, legal service to organizations such as a church, civic or community service organization relating to a project seeking to address the problems of the poor would qualify.”

What is the Community Counsel Program?

The Community Counsel Program is a legal assistance program for eligible community-based non-profit organizations. Community Counsel Program provides pro bono transactional services to organizations that are working to better the economic and social conditions for low-income residents and communities in distress.

Typically, the organizations we serve have less discretionary dollars in their budgets, and generally cannot afford the fees charged by a private law firm

When organizations are unable to afford an attorney:

- They either do not address their legal issues, or
- They hire attorneys with programming dollars thereby reducing the services they deliver to the community.
